
CYBERPATRIOT VIII REGISTRATION IS NOW OPEN

Astronomy track – \$30

Cadets **MUST** have completed the CAP Model Rocketry Program and the Wright Brothers Achievement to attend.
 -Sun (daytime) and stargazing (nighttime) astronomy lessons and activities.

Flight Simulator track – \$30

Cadets **MUST** have completed the CAP Model Rocketry Program and the Wright Brothers Achievement to attend.
 - Comprised of a Microsoft X-gold flight simulator computer program with accompanying yoke and rudder pedals, cadets will learn and perform flight activities to include using flight planning aeronautical charts and lessons to extend the experiential portion of the flight simulator program.

ACCOMMODATIONS

EXPECTATIONS

Training will be conducted in accordance with CAPR 50-20 CAP Model Rocketry Program and the CAP Model Rocketry Program book, to include building several models with differing fuel sources, then demonstrate their successful launch, flight, and recovery; and/or CAP AEX MARC module. Cadets who are between phases can complete partial tracks and their material fee will be reduced, accordingly. Please identify these cadets upon RSVP. Teams may arrive after 1800 hrs on Friday to remain overnight. Sign in will begin at 0800 hrs Saturday. Training will conclude at 1800 hrs on Saturday and reconvene at 0800 hrs on Sunday. Training will conclude and members will demobilize NLT 1600 hrs on Sunday.

All tracks will have instruction in Robotics. CAP Orientation Flights are also planned.

BACKGROUND

Cadets and Senior Members of the Missouri Wing - Civil Air Patrol report to Whiteman AFB to assist the 509th Bomb Wing and work CAP recruiting booth and STEM display areas.

CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS

CAP will have an aircraft static display and special purpose vehicle display that will be used for the base of all CAP operations.

PREREQUISITES

Before 5 June 2015, all units must submit a roster of participating members that include their Social Security Numbers, Dates of Birth, and State ID/Driver's License Numbers for the MSA and EAL. US Citizens only. Senior members must have completed Level I and Cadets should have their Curry Achievement, and be current Safety Education Requirements outlined in CAPR 62-1 paragraph 4.

EXPECTATIONS

Participating Members may report Friday evening to S-6 (Wing HQ) to remain overnight (RON). An MSA will be in place to eat at the DFAC (Cash Only). Those not wishing to stay at S-6 may arrive at 0800 and use general parking and entry.

PARKING

Vehicles will be parked near S-6 for those RON. All others must use general parking and entry.

UNIFORM WEAR

All uniform combinations MUST be compliant IAW CAPM 39-1. Utility uniforms preferred.

FUNDING/REIMBURSEMENT

Reimbursement for fuel or per diem must be approved by your unit finance committee.

MEALS

Only those on the MSA/EAL can eat at the DFAC. All others will be able to purchase meals from the food vendors.

SUPPORTING THE AIRSHOW


All CAP Members are required to support CAP Operations at the Airshow. Time will be allocated to spectate along with work/rest cycles.

FOREWORD

Civil Air Patrol has been patrolling our nation's coastal borders since CAP's inception. Today, the coastlines are borderless with the onset of cyber vulnerability and attacks. CAP is participating in a timely technological initiative, CyberPatriot, sponsored by the Air Force Association, to educate the next generation of patriotic cyber defenders of our nation's security and infrastructure.

PURPOSE

CyberPatriot is a cutting-edge activity open to ANY middle or high school student team in the nation. There are two parallel divisions: Open Division (any high school) and All Service Division (any CAP, Sea, or JROTC cadets). Each team defends a computer network against a virtual cyber-attack. Several rounds of competition culminate in a national competition for both divisions each March in National Harbor, MD, just outside Washington, D.C. All Division teams and Open Division teams can work and train together since they are not competing against each other in these parallel virtual competitions that lead up to the nation competition, so JOIN HANDS and TALENT and gather TEAMS to train together. Together Each Achieves More!

Adults who are coaching or mentoring a group of 2-5 young people in CyberPatriot teams are to be commended for going above and beyond! We encourage other interested adults to help form a team for 2016!

INTERNET CONNECTIVITY

For those squadrons with limited internet connectivity, the AFA CyberPatriot office is offering the loan of three AT&T air cards per team by request.

LIMITED COMPUTER SUPPORT

For those squadrons with limited computer support, the AFA CyberPatriot office is trying to help support those teams with computer loans.

LIMITED ACCESS TO CYBER PROFESSIONALS

For those squadrons with limited access to adults with cyber expertise, the AFA CyberPatriot office will help assign a mentor to assist the squadron's team coach and cadets.

FREE STEM PROGRAM

With this FREE STEM program for all CAP squadrons across the nation, squadron commanders and AE/CP leaders are strongly encouraged to at least register a small team of 2-5 cadets and one adult coach to facilitate the program. Whether the team moves to the national level or not, just the experience to provide the cadets with important cyber security career preparation experience is priceless.
